

Wood Articles			By new dispositions of the SENASAG (organization for the control of plagues), the shipping that contain wood, like finished furniture, adornments, packing material, etc., must be fumigated in destination and to count on their respective Phytosanitary certificate of this organization.

Manufactured Objects that Contaminate the Atmosphere			For the dispositions of IBMETRO (Institute of Quality Norms of Bolivia, entity for the pollution control), shipments that have manufactured objects that contaminate the atmosphere, like refrigerators, motors, oxygen tanks, vehicles, etc. must be made the inspection in destination, in order to obtain the certification of gases granted and not noxious to the atmosphere.

<p>Fumigation of imported and exported wooden crates</p>		<p>The Bolivian Government adopted ISPM-15 (International standards for Phytosanitary Measures Publication 15) Guidelines for Regulating Wood Packaging Material in International Trade (aka NIFM-15) to standardise the treatment of wood packing materials used for the transport of goods.</p> <p>Shipments into or out of the country in wooden packaging, need to have a Seal, certifying that the shipment has received the required treatment (HT = Heated Treatment [a minimum wood core temperature of 56°C for a minimum of 30 minutes] or fumigation with Methyl Bromide (MT). Labels and adhesives are not allowed.
